Hi Parents:

Happy Tuesday! I want to thank everyone who helped to chaperone and/or drive for Outdoor School. The students had a lot of fun and experienced something no other 6th grade class from LLA had gotten to experience with the snow. I do have more pictures to share. We want to be sure you are aware of the date if you need to take time off from work.

As we have come back into the classroom since Presley's tragic death, I have taken time to check-in and see how everyone in class is doing. The majority of the class has been very open and has enjoyed sharing special memories of Presley. Week of Prayer has been wonderful. The theme is "Wild About Jesus." Yesterday, Pastor Sam talked about how **Jesus loves all of us.** Pastor Sam talked about the fact that we have lost someone dear to us, but we will never forget her. She also shared that grief exists because love exists. Today, Mrs. Nelson talked about how **Jesus includes all of us** and shared about friendship. Thursday would have been Presley's 12th birthday. Some of the students have asked to decorate her desk. Students do not need to bring anything in for this, but I just wanted you to be aware because I know some are planning to make cards and/or bring in flowers or something else to place on her desk. Pastor Sam spent extra time with the class on Monday. She did some activities with the class. They were able to draw, play with playdoh and just talk about their feelings. The class responded very well to these activities.
