Hi Parents:

Happy Tuesday! I will be sending Wednesday Folders home tomorrow; thank you for signing and returning your child's folder on Thursday. By this Friday students should have 50% of their AR goal. Please continue to check your child's progress on MyLLA regularly.

Today we talked about our Canada section 1 project that is due Mon., May 8. This is a social studies and writing assignment. Last week all students selected a province or territory they will be researching and were able to check out Canada books from the classroom and library. Time will be given daily for students to work on this project in class. The project must be typed and drawings must be completed on plain white paper.

Next week our class will be completing our Spring MAP testing. We will be taking the tests in the classroom from 9:00-10:30 a.m. (M, W, Th) and 8:30-10:00 a.m. on Friday. Students do not need to prepare ahead of time for these tests.

Our chapter 6 math is scheduled for Mon., May 8. Students will be completing some review activities and practice tests in preparation for the final test. Students are also encouraged to review their work on the Big Ideas website and practice Ch. 6 concepts on IXL to help prepare for the final test.

You should have received an email from the Junior High Principal today about the 6<sup>th</sup> grade math placement test. All 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be taking this test on May 18. Please note that there is nothing your child needs to do to prepare for the math placement test. Students will be provided with a Ch. 6 Post-Course Test that they can use to review concepts, but once again your child does not need to study for this test. This review information will be passed out as we get closer to the test date.

Thank you for helping your child to keep their Social Studies projects in a safe place. We will be using them in May for our classroom museum. Students should have the following projects: Maya, Aztec and Inca project, a rainforest animal, a rain stick, and a gourd.

This Saturday, April 29, is the memorial service for our dear classmate, Presley, and her amazing mother, Heather. ## CLASSROOM NEWS:
