Hi Parents:

Hope you are having a terrific day! Third quarter ends next Friday, March 24. Students need to meet their AR goal by Wednesday, March 22. By this Friday students should have 95% of their AR goal. We completed another literature book today in class that students were able to test on. Students have had the opportunity to test on 29 ½ AR points from books we have read as a class and in library. Several students have already achieved their AR goal for third quarter. :)

Wednesday folders and Parent-Teacher Conference forms will be sent home tomorrow. Please sign and return your child's folder on Thursday. Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences are **OPTIONAL**. **Please return the form and either mark that you don't feel a conference is necessary OR mark the three times that will work best for your schedule. Please return your form by this Friday, March 17**, so I am able to schedule conferences over the weekend and send out confirmation letters next Wednesday.

Our chapter 5 Math test is scheduled for Monday, March 20. We are completing some review activities along with two practice tests to help prepare. Students are also encouraged to review all of their completed assignments on the Big Ideas website and review Ch. 5 concepts on IXL to prepare for the final test.

Just a reminder that students who did not complete their rain forest animals in class need to complete them at home. Students may take the needed materials from the classroom to finish their projects. **This project is due this Friday, March 17**. Please note that the paper mache' does take time to dry, so students should not be waiting until the night before to complete their animal.

Often spring cleaning happens around this time. Please don't get rid of any of your child's projects from Social Studies. We will be using them at the end of the school year for our classroom museum. To date students should have their Maya and Aztec projects, a rainforest animal (due by March 17), a rain stick and a gourd. Thanks for helping your child to keep his/her projects in a safe place. ☺

The Wednesday after spring break, April 5, we will be heading to Crestline for Outdoor School. **Please note that if you have not been cleared to be an overnight chaperone or a day visitor, you need to be cleared by this Friday, March 17. The elementary office needs to be the one to inform the 6<sup>th</sup> grade teachers that you are cleared. If you are a day chaperone, you are NOT allowed to bring any children for the day.
